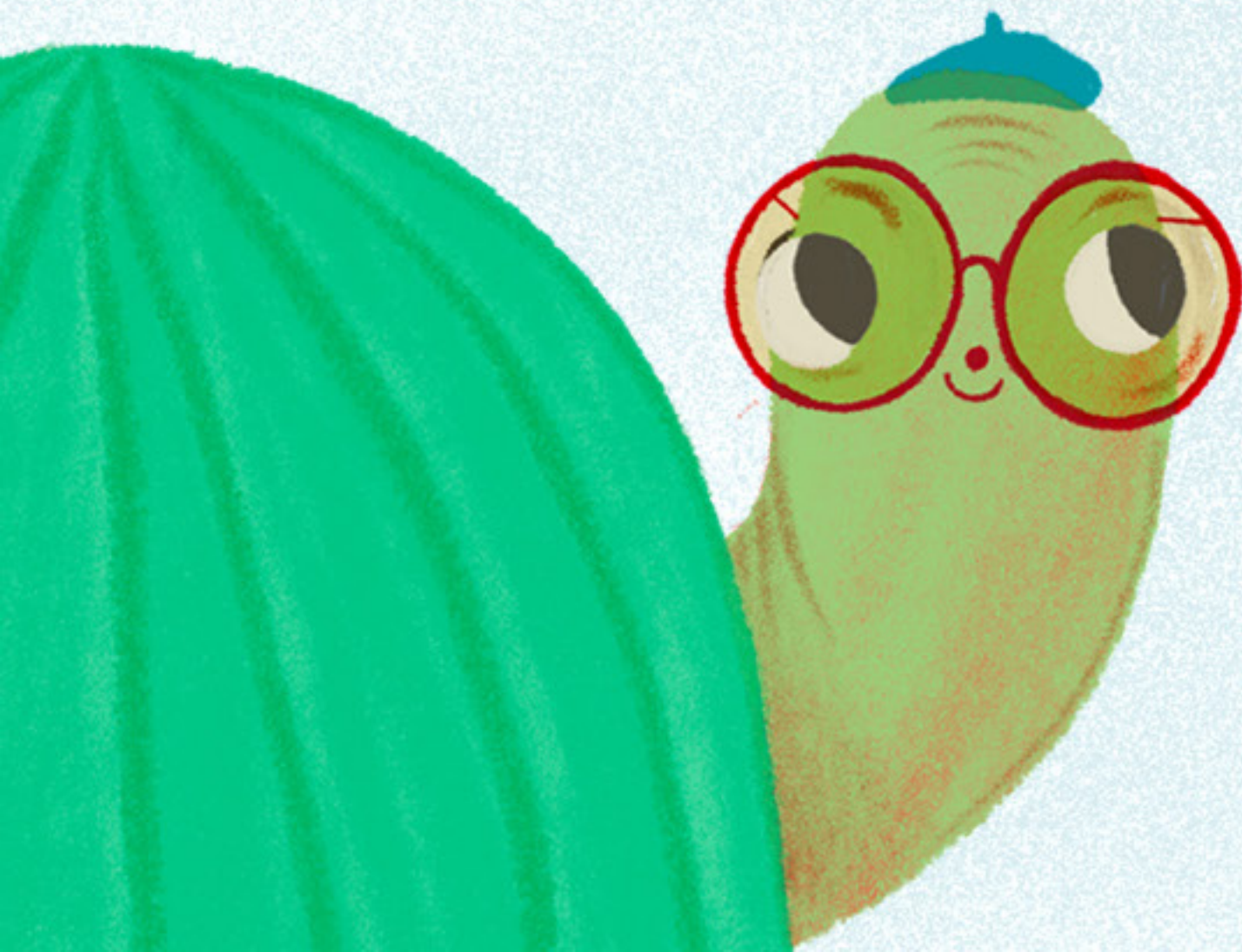


Sea the Love

She gives the students their first assignment – to talk about one thing that makes their family unique.

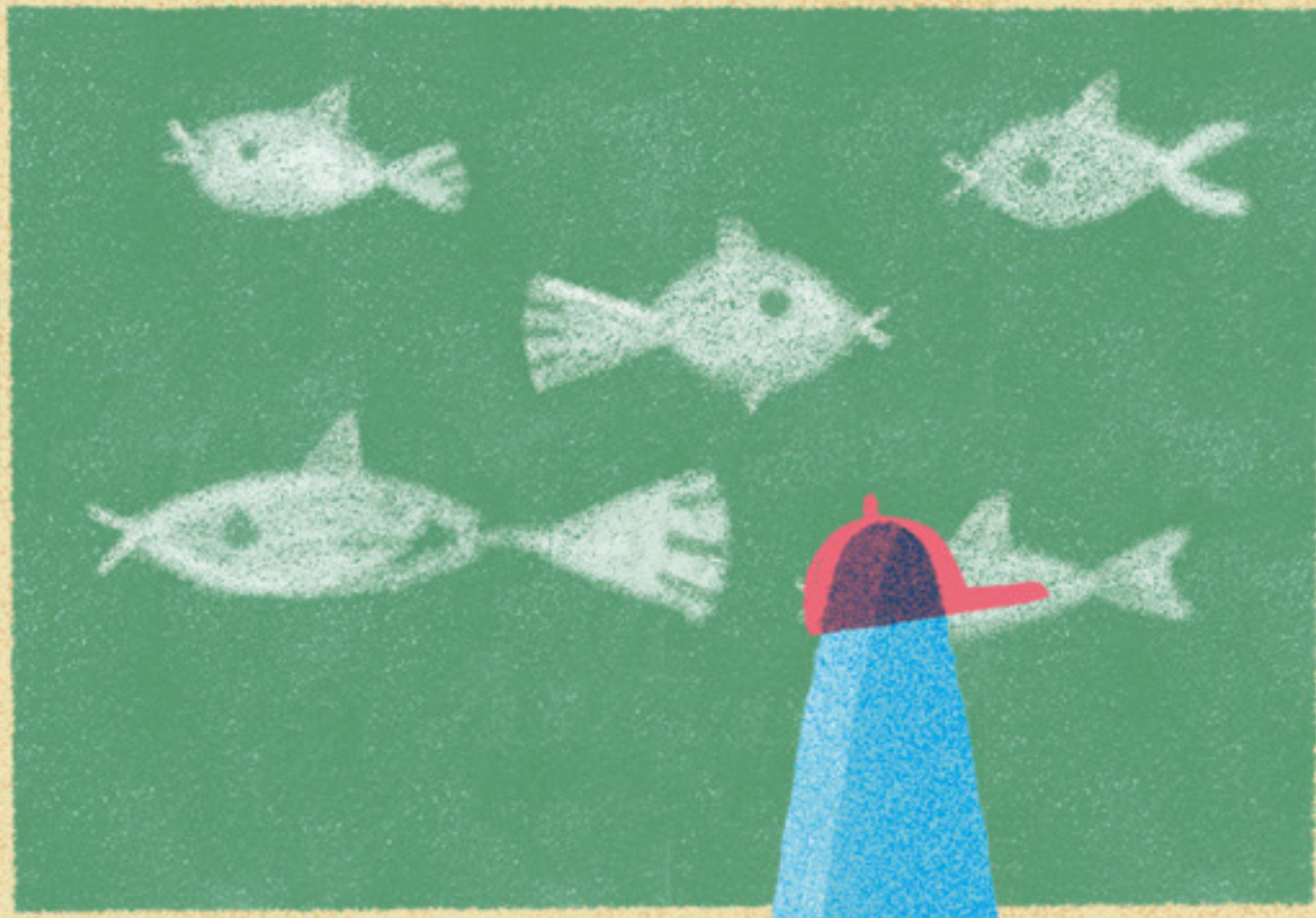
“In my hundreds of years as a teacher, I've learned there's something special about every family,” Mrs. Olive says

At lunchtime, Dash decides to make new friends and ask about their families.

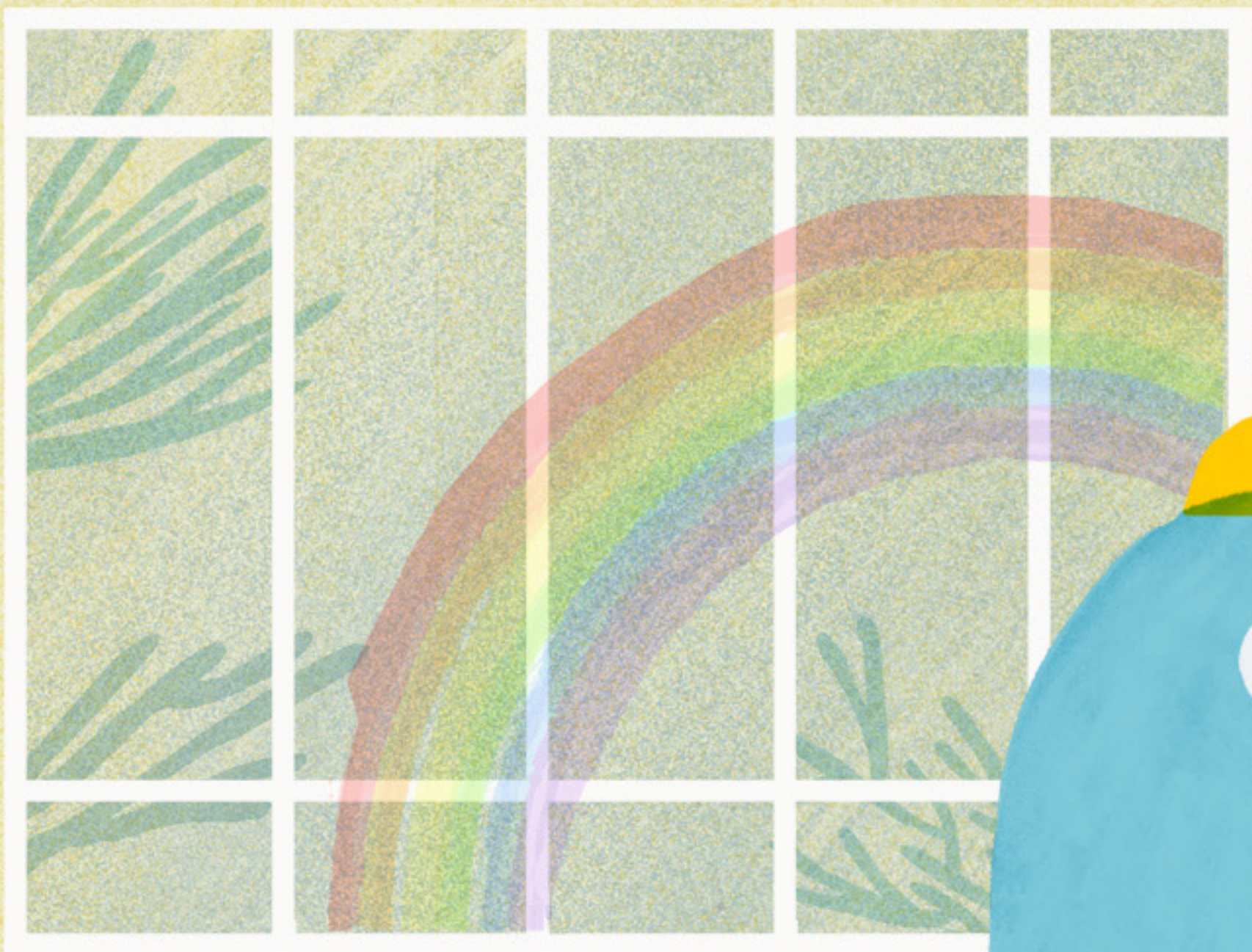
Maybe they can help him find something interesting to tell the class.

Dash looks confused.



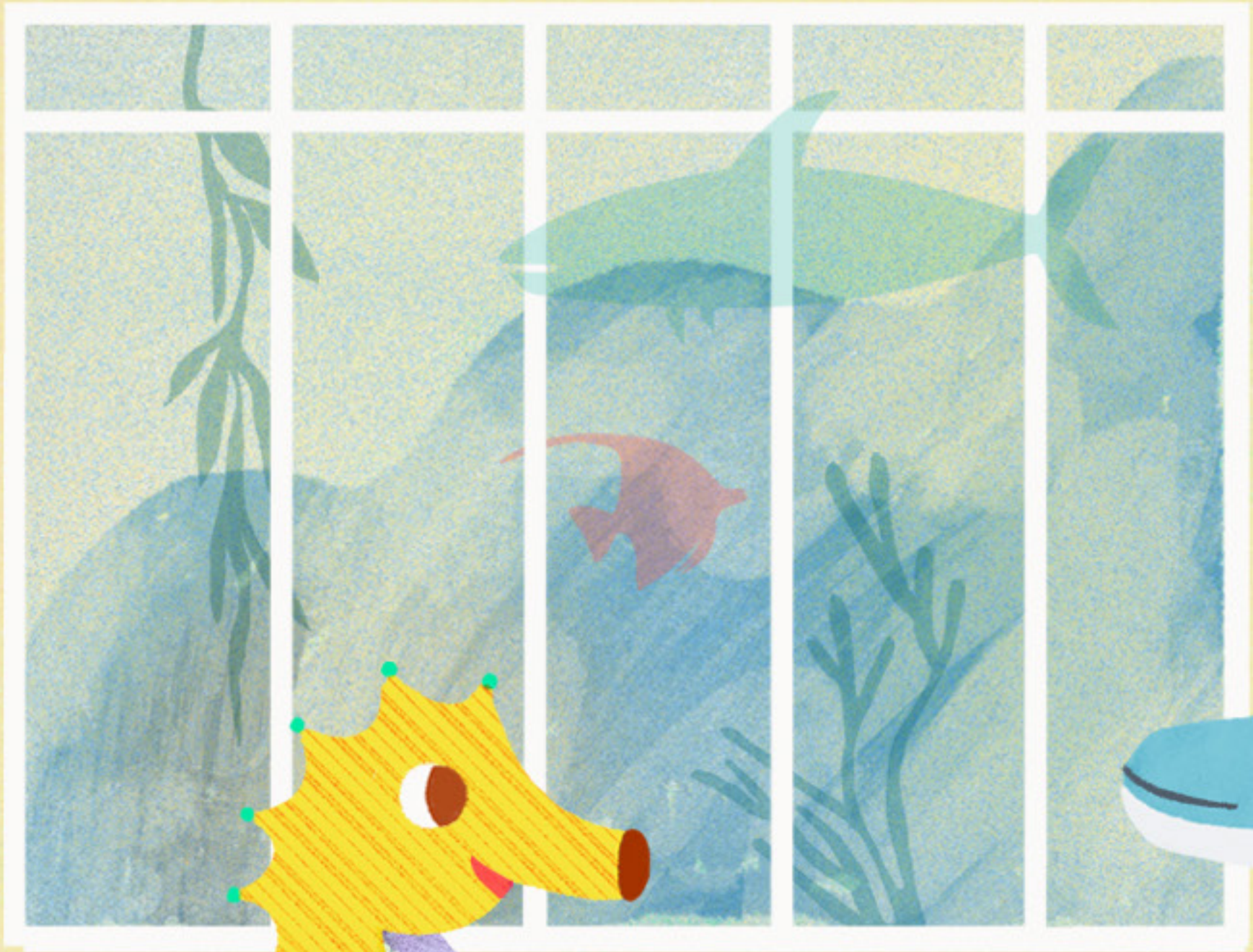


Callisto says her parents were washed ashore
